

Stormwater Fees Assessed on DC Water Bills

 DC Water's Clean Rivers Impervious Area Charge (CRIAC) is used to fund the Clean Rivers Project in the combined sewer system (CSS)







Stormwater Fees Assessed on DC Water Bills

- DC Water's Clean Rivers Impervious Area Charge (CRIAC) is used to fund the Clean Rivers Project in the combined sewer system (CSS)
- D.C. Government Stormwater Fee is used to fund Clean Water Act compliance in the separate sewer system (MS4)
- Both fees are assessed on the monthly DC Water bill
- Based on amount of impervious surface
 - Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU)
 - 1 ERU = 1,000 sf of impervious area
 - **10,800** sf of impervious = **10.8 ERUs**
 - CRIAC is \$23.00 per ERU
 - DC Stormwater Fee is \$2.67 per ERU

CRIAC Residential Relief Programs

Who's Eligible?

- CAP: Households below 60% SMI
- CAP2: Households below 80% AMI
- CAP3: Households below 100% AMI

- CAP: Average annual discount \$760
 - 50% CRIAC discount, 4 CCF credit on Water & Sewer Services
- CAP2: Average annual discount \$520
 - 50% CRIAC discount and 3 CCF credit on Water & Sewer Services
- CAP3: Average annual discount \$210
 - 75% CRIAC discount

Clean Rivers Impervious Area Charge Nonprofit Relief Program

Who's Eligible?

 Charitable nonprofits, houses of worship, and cemeteries

What's Required?

- Financial hardship in payment of Clean Rivers charge (CRIAC)
 - Hardship is established if CRIAC is more than 1.0% of organization's net revenue
- Stormwater mitigation1. Planting one tree per ERU;

 - 2. Managing 10% of impervious area through installation of green infrastructure (GI); or
 - 3. Funding GI on another property (10 SRCs or \$20/ERŬ)

Incentive Amount:

Up to a 90% discount on the CRIAC







RiverSmart Homes

Who's Eligible?

Residential properties up to 4 units

What's Required?

 Request free audit from DOEE and schedule install of eligible green infrastructure with an approved contractor

- Trees are free!
- Homeowner copay amounts:
 - \$100 per rain garden
 - \$100 per Bayscaping install
 - \$50-\$70 per rain barrel





RiverSmart Rebates

Who's Eligible?

ALL private properties (multifamily, residential, commercial, & educational)

What's Required?

- Installation of green infrastructure (separate from RiverSmart Homes)
- Application timeline of approximately 2 months

- Trees: Up to \$100 per tree (25 max)
- Rain barrel: \$2 per gallon captured
- Rain garden: \$3 per sq ft treated
- Revegetation: \$5 per sq ft
- Pavers: \$10 per sq ft







RiverSmart Communities

Who's Eligible?

Nonprofits and places of worship (includes some cemeteries)

What's Required?

 Apply for consideration through competitive grant. Projects must be voluntary and recipients must perform outreach.

Incentive Amount:

+ \$30,000 on average; DOEE manages design and install

RiverSmart Schools

Who's Eligible?

All K-12 schools in the District (DCPS, private, and Public Charter)

What's Required?

Apply for consideration through competitive grant. Schools receive training and perform outreach

Incentive Amount:

 Up to \$70,000 for schoolyard greening & training; DOEE manages design and install

RiverSmart Rooftops

Who's Eligible?

 All District property owners (including residential, commercial, & educational)

What's Required?

Apply for rebate before installing green roof

- \$10 per square foot (in CSS)
- \$15 per square foot (in MS4)

RiverSmart Rewards

Who's Eligible?

 All District property owners with green infrastructure (GI)


What's Required?

Install GI through any voluntary or regulatory program

- Up to 55% off DOEE
 Stormwater Fee
- Up to 4% off CRIAC

Stormwater Retention Credit (SRC) Trading Program

Who's Eligible?

 Properties and SRC-aggregating businesses that voluntarily install green infrastructure

What's Required?

- DOEE approval of Stormwater Management Plan
- Successfully pass construction and maintenance inspections
- Maintenance contract/plan

- Average \$1.85/SRC on market last12 months
- Sell to DOEE at fixed rates through SRC Price Lock Program

SRC Price Lock Program


• Who's Eligible?

 New, voluntary green infrastructure (GI) projects in MS4

• What's Required?

- Preliminary GI project design
- Letter of support from site owner

- Opportunity to sell SRCs to DOEE, while still having opportunity to sell on market
- Tidal MS4:
 - \$1.70/SRC, years 1 6
 - \$0.40/SRC, years 7 12
- Non-Tidal MS4
 - \$1.95/SRC, years 1 6
 - \$0.40/SRC, years 7 12





SRC Site Evaluation

• Who's Eligible?

Properties in MS4 with ≥ 0.5 acres

• What's Required?

- Apply through DOEE's website
- Generally describe your interest in green infrastructure
- Interest in participating in the SRC
 Price Lock Program

• Incentive Amount:

Free evaluation of green infrastructure opportunities on the site

SRC Aggregator Startup Grant

Who's Eligible?

 SRC-aggregating businesses working in the MS4

• What's Required?

- Apply with a plan for identifying sites, conducting outreach, and developing preliminary green infrastructure designs
- Intent to participate in the SRC
 Price Lock Program

Incentive Amount:

Grant of up to \$75,000
