- 1. Except when they are recognized to speak, all attendees to the virtual meeting should mute their devices to avoid disruptions from background noises.

- 3. After a presenter completes his or her statement, committee members will have an opportunity to ask their questions or make comments.
- 4. During meetings, committee members should use the chat function to ask questions or to request to make a comment; they will then be recognized by the Co-Chair.
- 5. Speakers must limit any statements or questions to the time allotted.
- 6. Every committee member will have an opportunity to be heard once on an issue before any member is heard twice.
- 7. We understand that sometimes issues may provoke strong emotions and that these expectations may be forgotten. Part of the Co-Chair's job is to remind you of these norms during the meeting.
- 8. Comments that are personal attacks, vulgar, or obscene may be ruled out of order by the committee Co-Chairs. Co-Chairs may prohibit conduct or comments that disrupt meetings.
