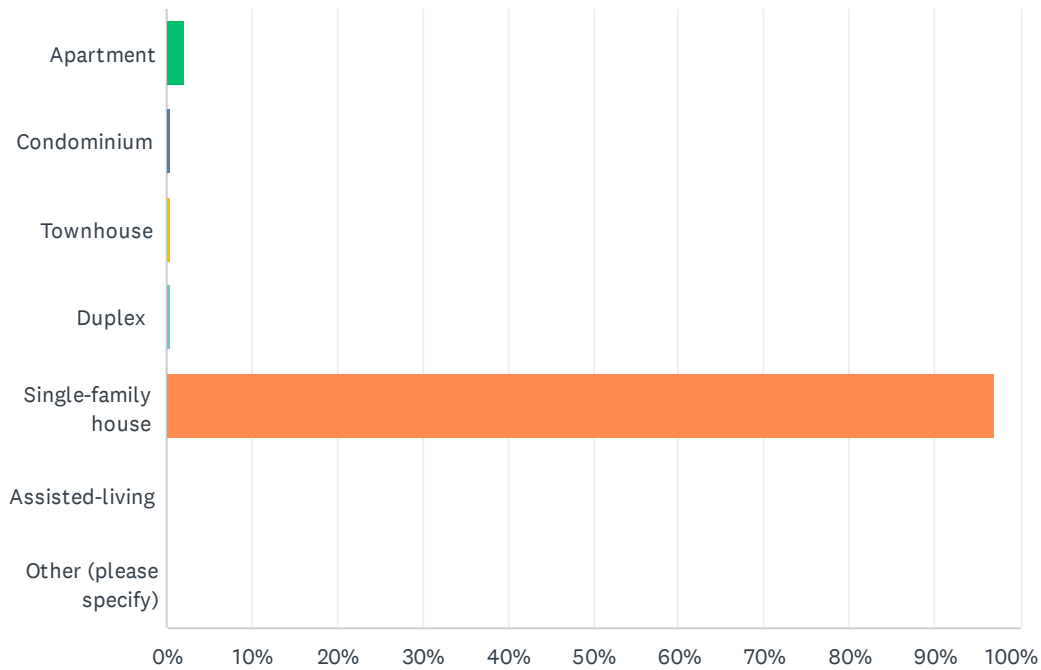

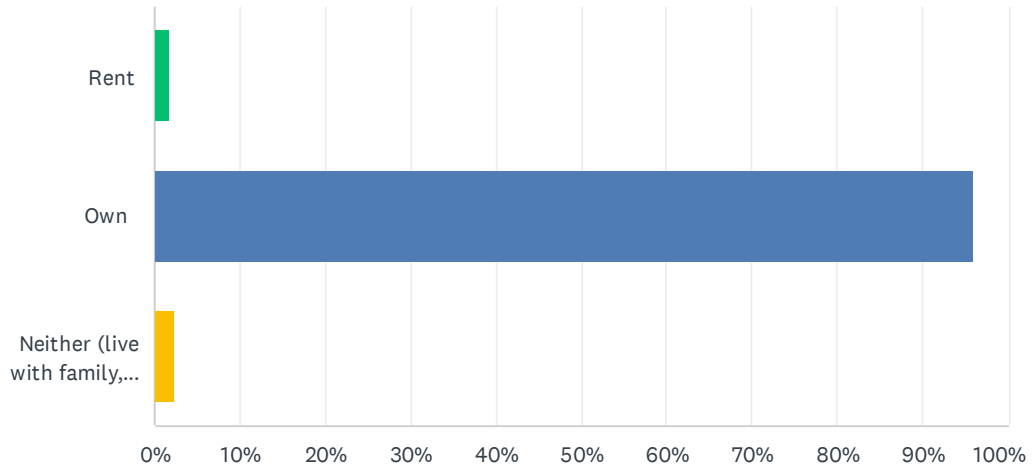

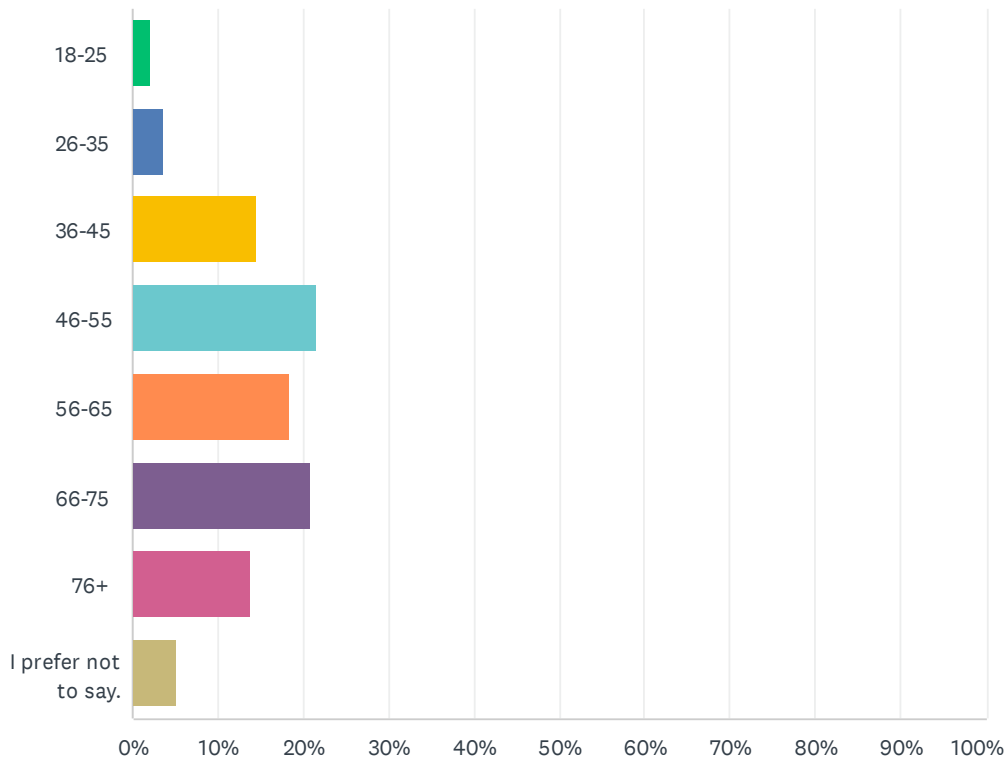

Q4 What is your age?

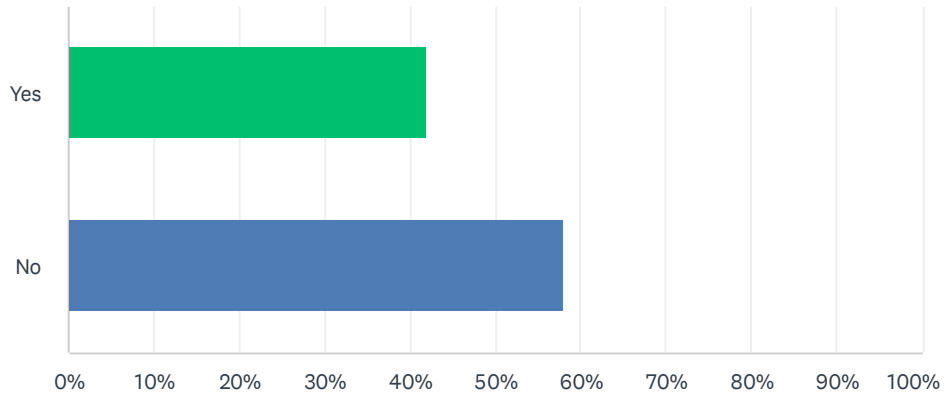

Q5 Do you have children aged 18 or under living with you?

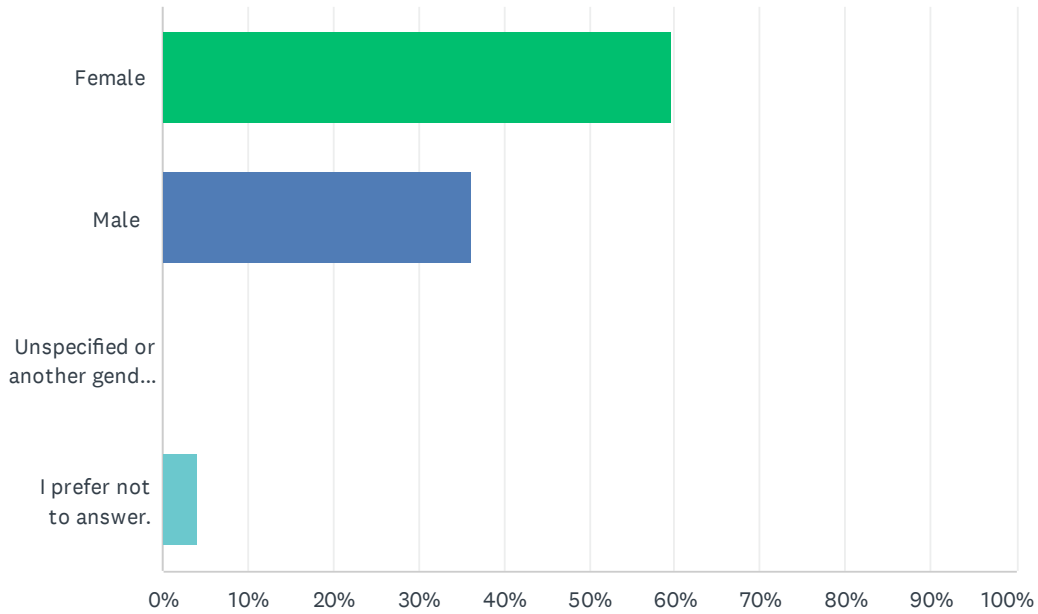

Q6 What is your gender?

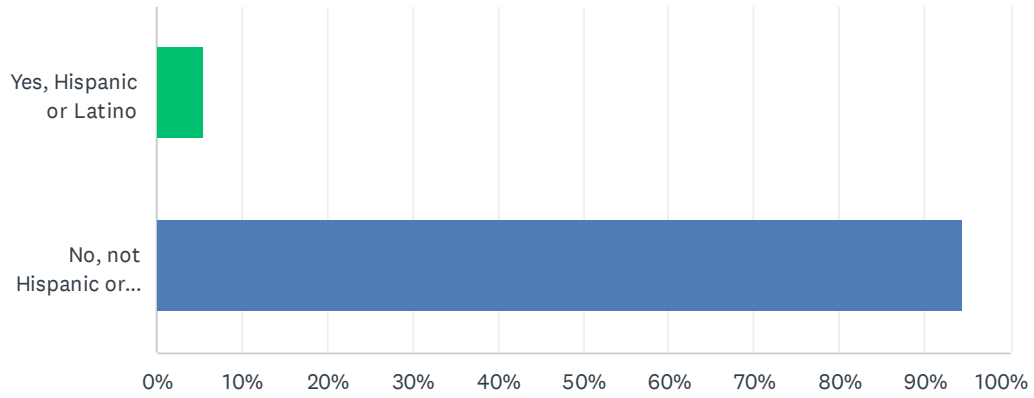

Q7 Are you Hispanic or Latino?

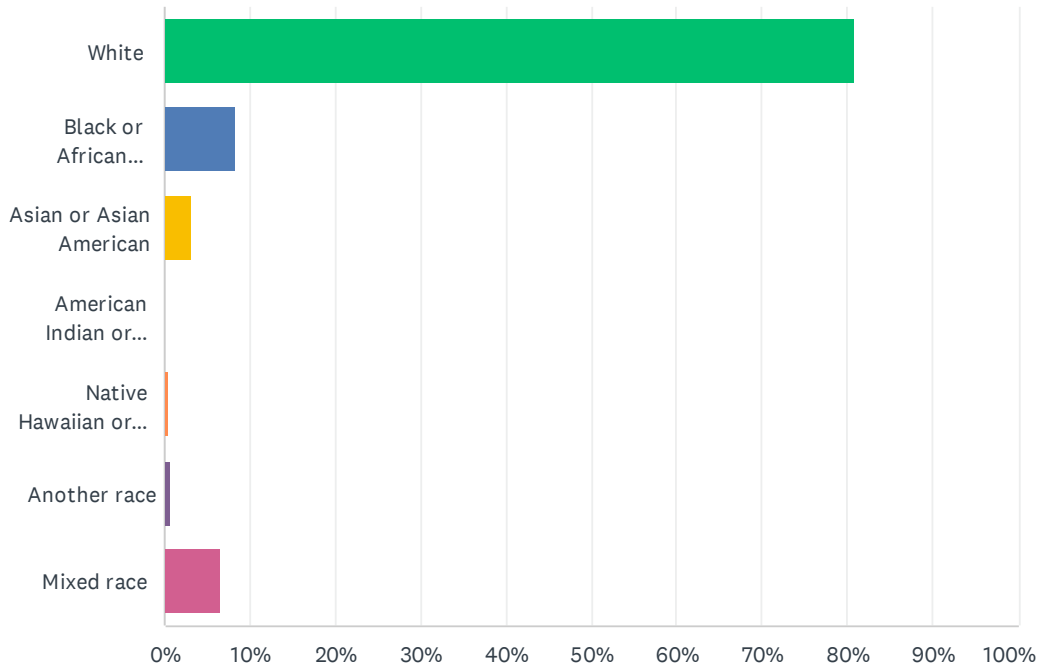

Q8 What is your race?

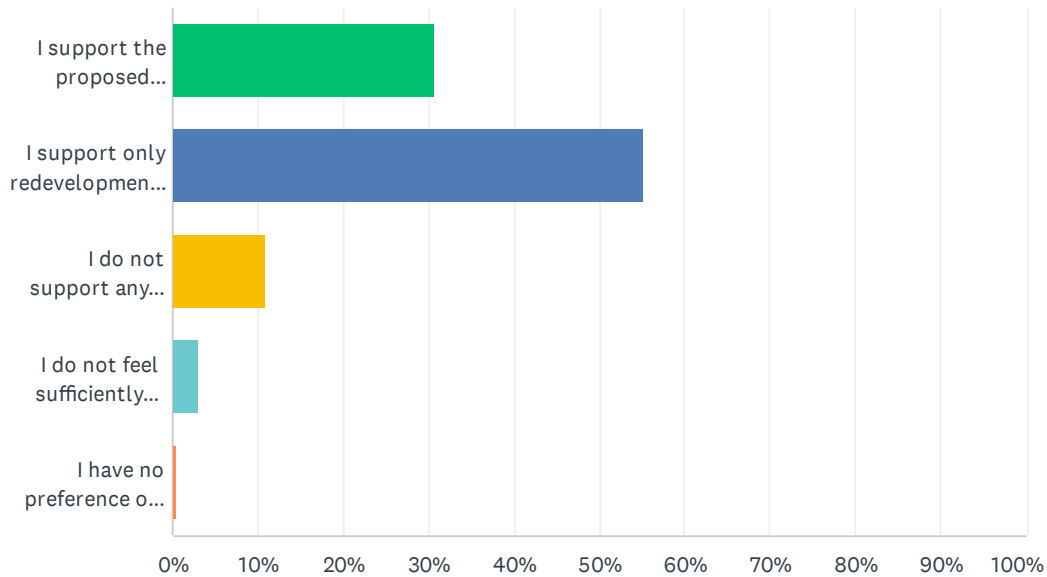

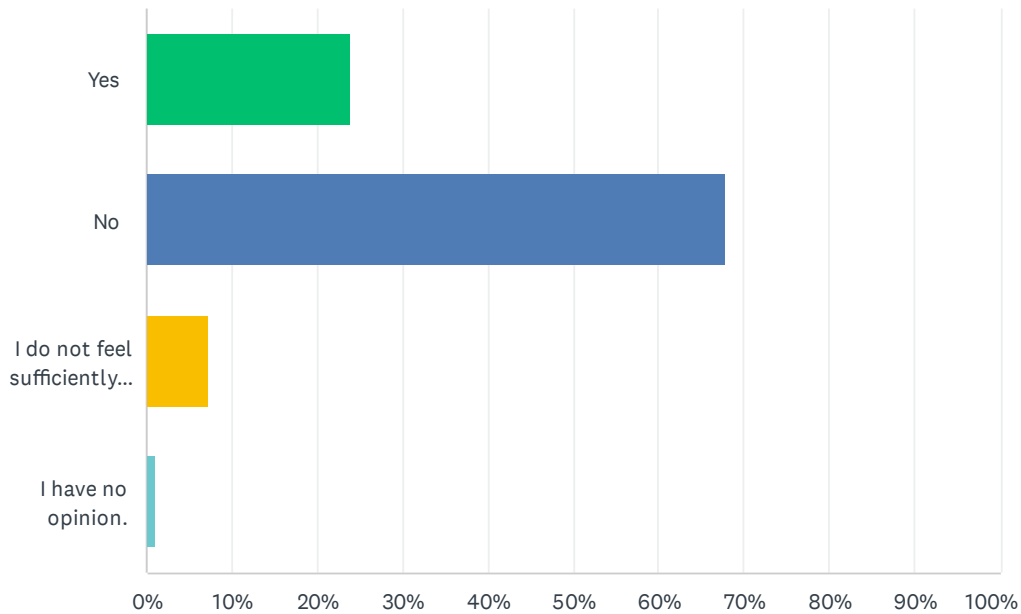

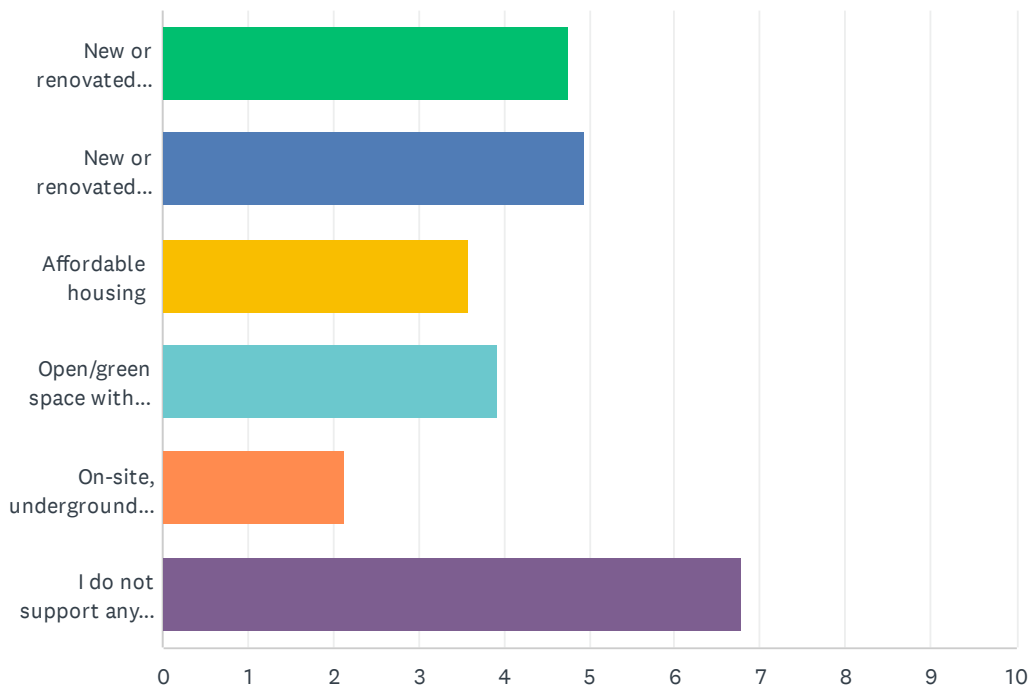

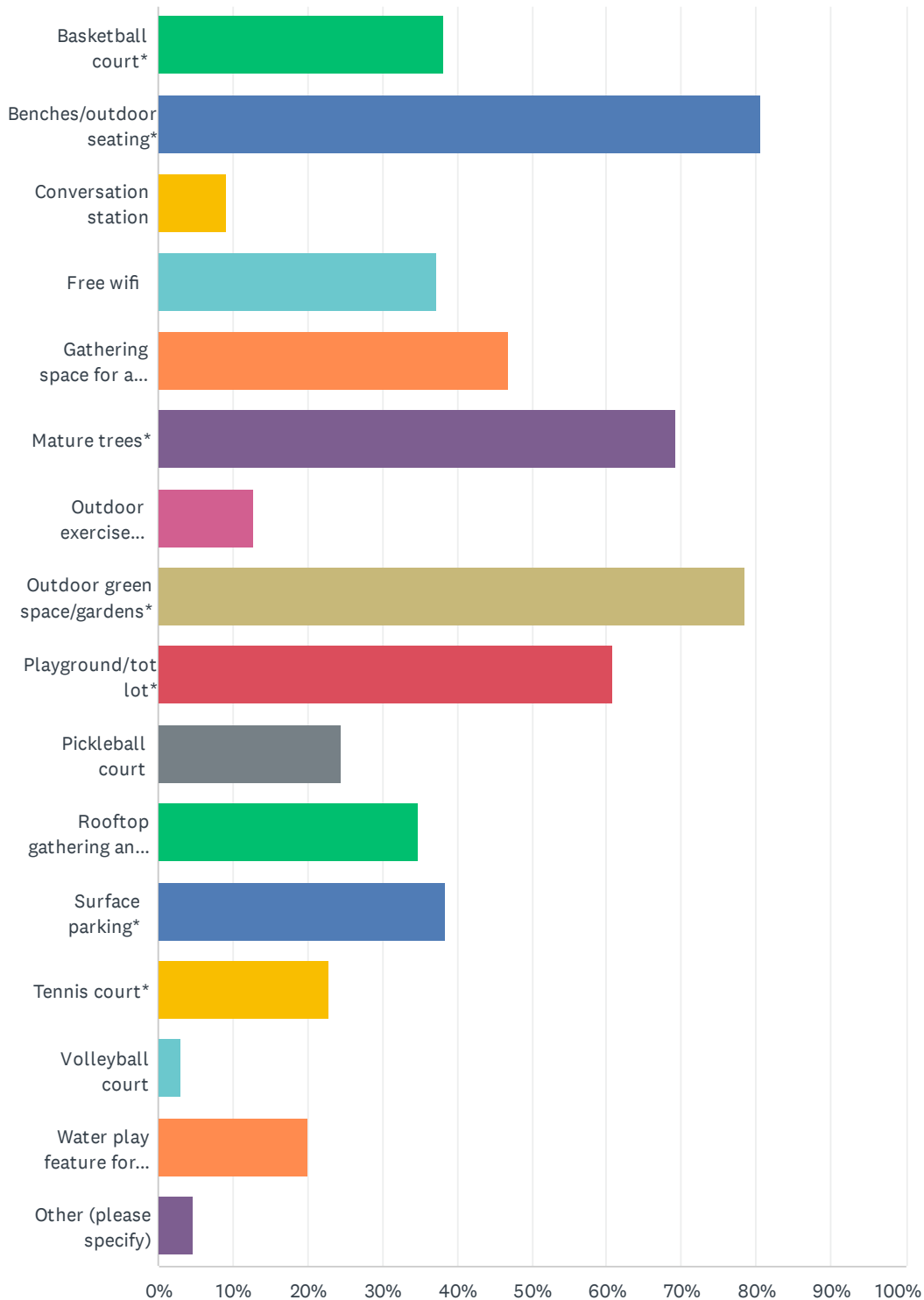

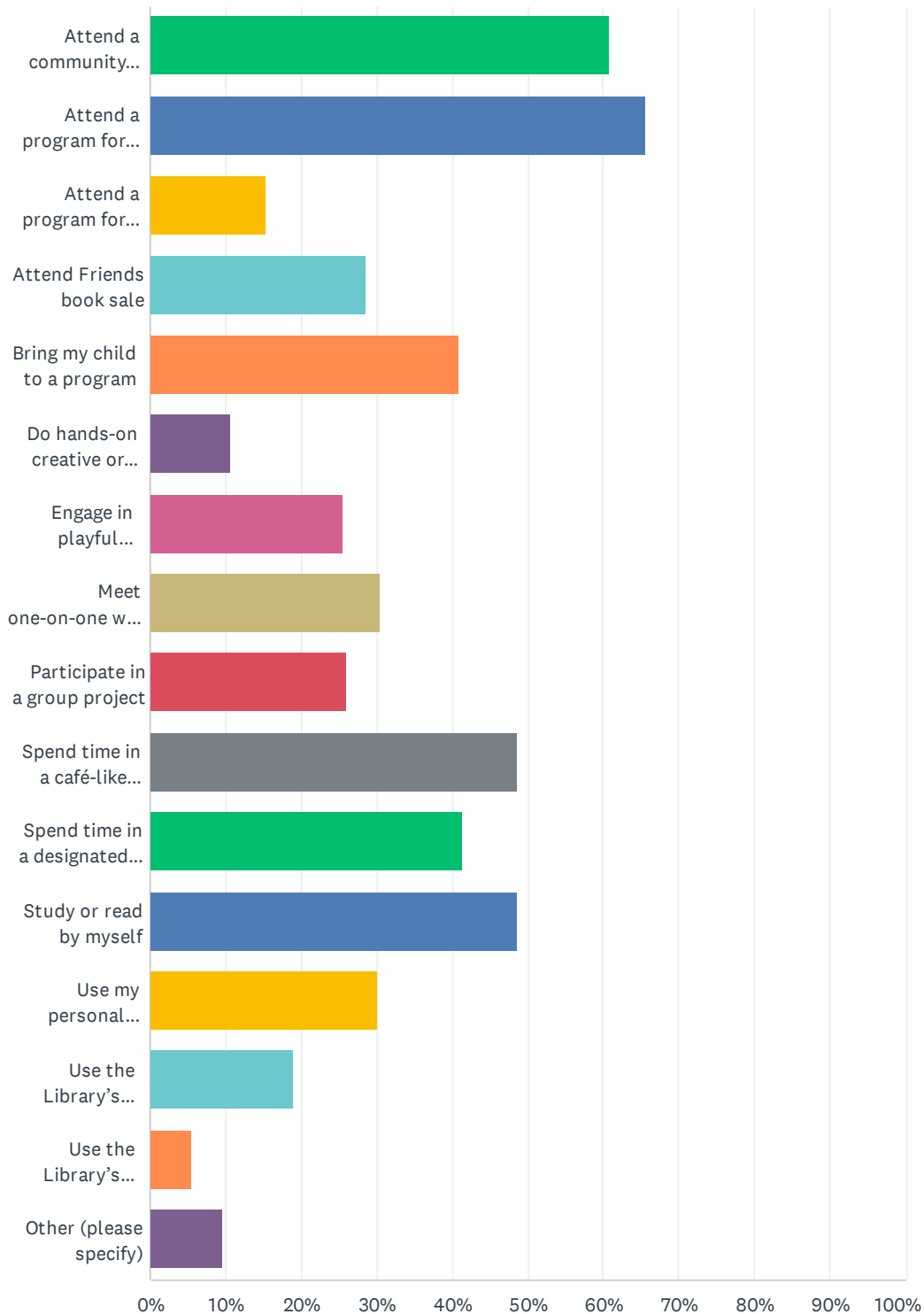

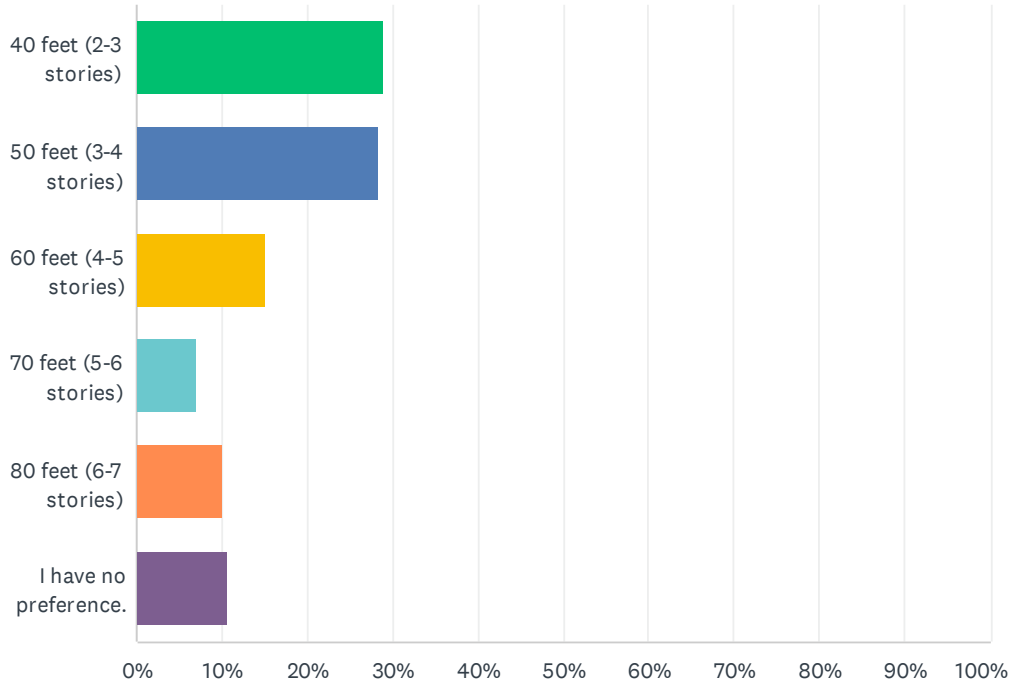

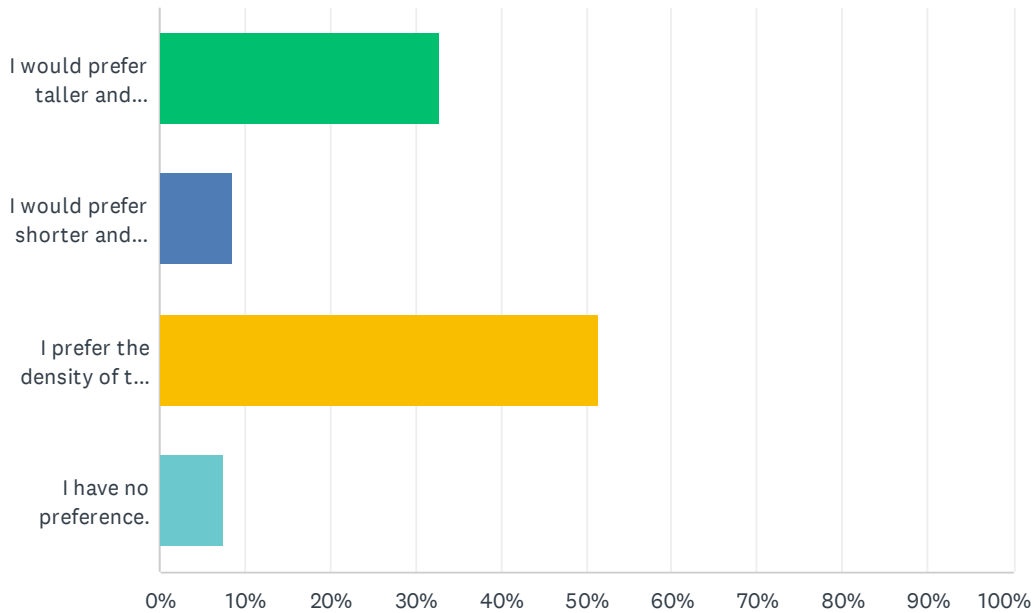

Q17 As to the density of the site, which would you prefer? (Trade-offs are inevitable in redeveloping the Community Center and Library site to incorporate housing.)

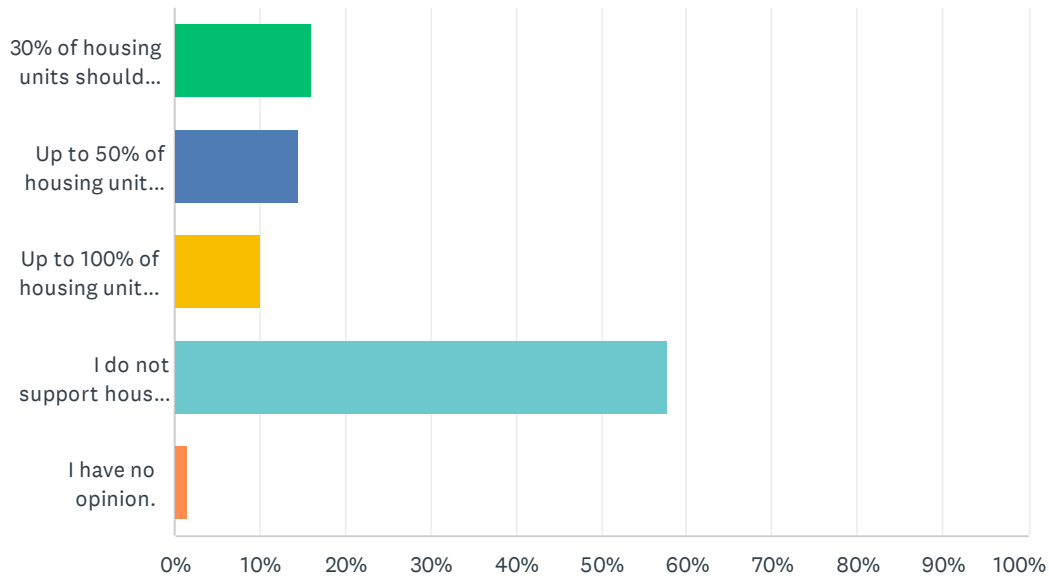

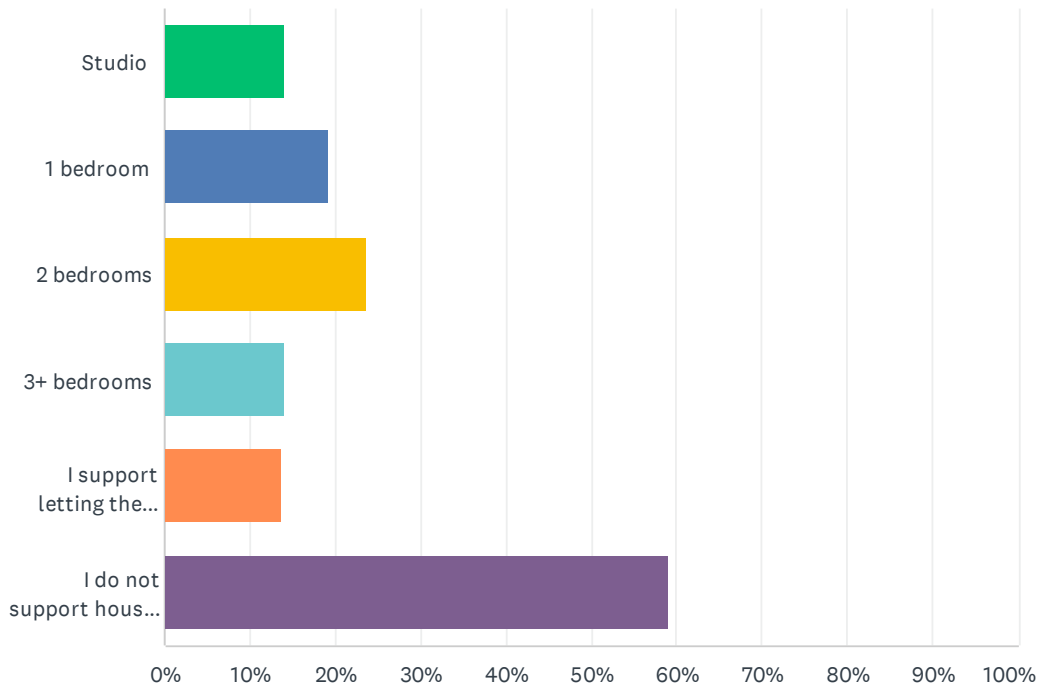

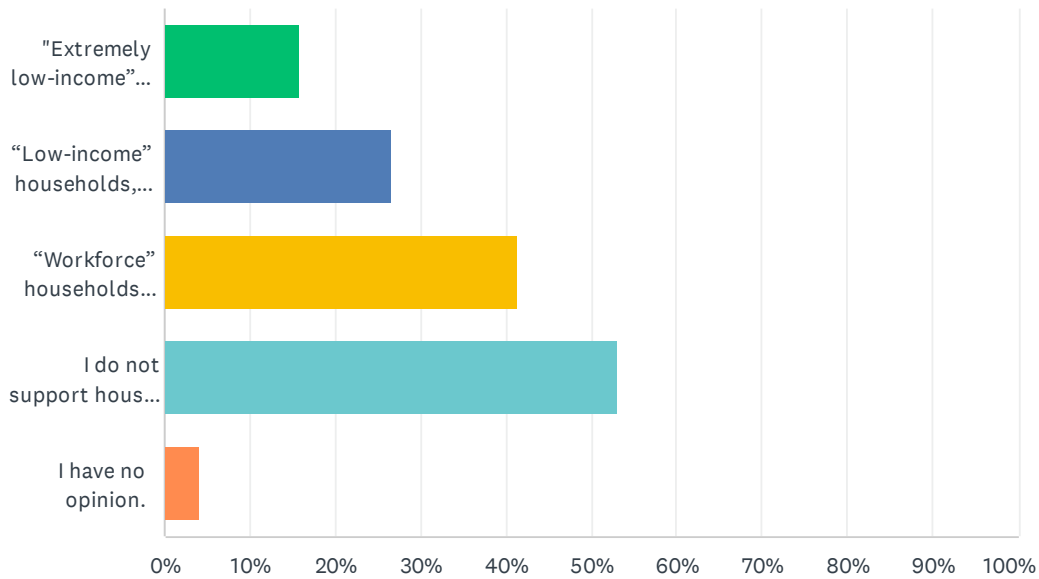

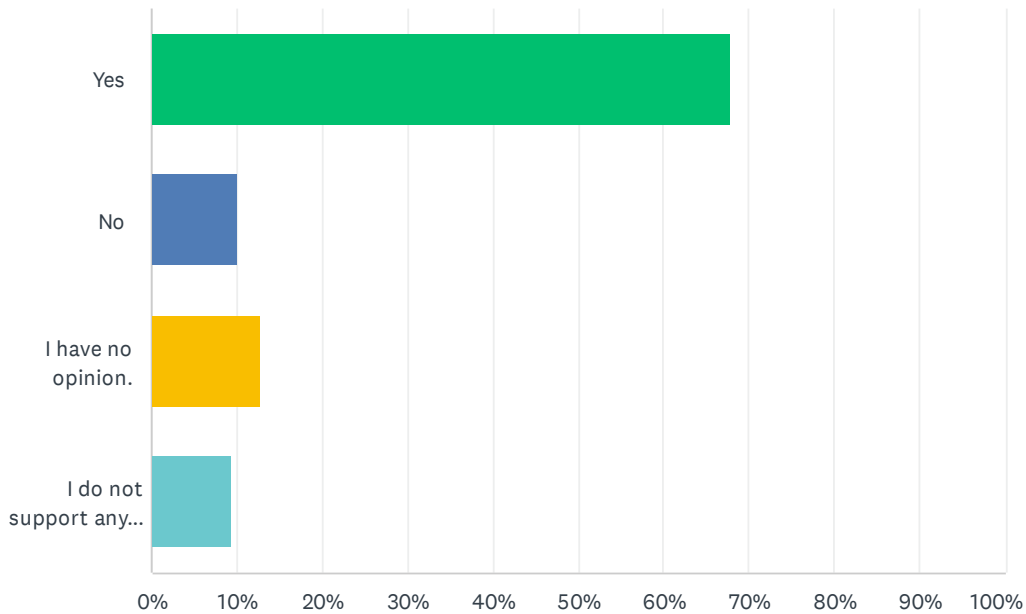

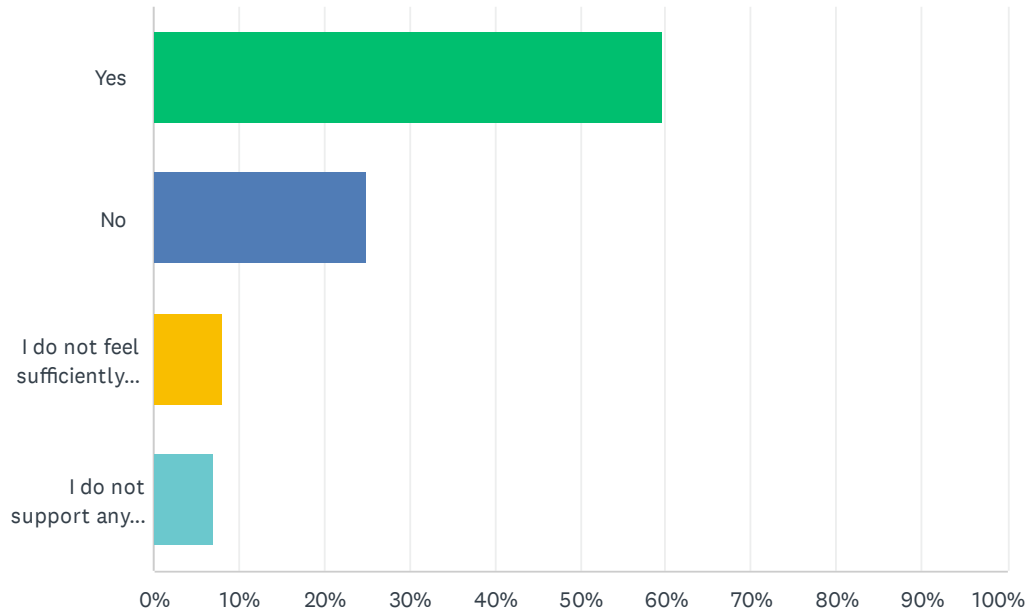

Q22 A new or renovated Community Center could also include limited retail such as a café. Would you support this?

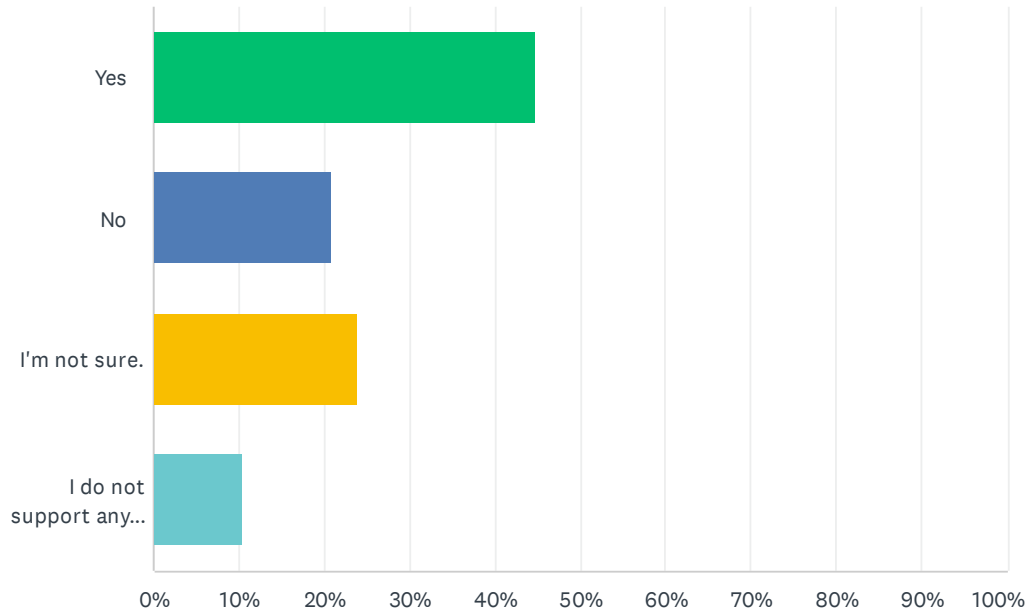
