
Q3 Do you own or rent your home?



Q5 Do you have children aged 18 or under living with you?










Q13 Which outdoor amenities would you most like to have in a new (or renovated) Community Center? Check up to seven. (* below denotes current amenity)



Q14 Which indoor amenities would you most like to have in a new (or renovated) Community Center? Check up to seven. (* below denotes current amenity).






Q15 The design features for a new (or renovated) Library would depend on your use. How do you envision using a redesigned library (in addition to checking out a book)? Check up to seven.



Q16 What is the maximum building height you would support for the Community Center and Library site?





Q17 As to the density of the site, which would you prefer? (Trade-offs are inevitable in redeveloping the Community Center and Library site to incorporate housing.)












