- Chevy Chase DC Historic District, comments by Mary Rowse, representing the Chevy Chase DC Conservancy (37:52)
  - Chevy Chase DC Historic District Zoom call January 30, 7-8:15 PM.
  - Proposal to be on the February 12 ANC agenda per consultation with Commissioners Gosselin and Lynch
  - Misperceptions about historic preservation permit approvals: 95-98% granted within a week; cases heard by the Historic Preservation Review Board usually complex: demolitions, new construction, etc.
  - Historic designation aims to preserve community involvement in local development, including for the ANC.
- Commission discussion and approval of BZA Special Exemption Application for 3702 Livingston Street, NW, approved by vote, 7-0 (43:51)
- **DDOT-proposed bioretention beds in Chevy Chase** (46:49)
  - Resolution proposed by Commissioner Lynch
  - DDOT comment period extended to February 9; neighborhood walkthrough set for February 2
  - Parking concerns resident input (51:30)
  - Bioretention bed placement, size, maintenance resident input (52:57)
  - o DDOT communication with the community (1:01:55)
  - Further on maintenance, technical issues, flooding (1:05:32)
  - Bioretention design and placement impacting homeowners (1:07:32)
  - Alternative approaches and locations, DDOT reactions (1:16:43)
  - o Problems with use of alleys is bioretention beds are installed (1:23:25)
  - Scheduling a special Commission meeting to finalize review and resolution, agreement to do so, suggested date Feb 6, to be confirmed (1:25:41)
  - Commissioners Gore, Gosselin, and Nash re tabling Lynch resolution pending the special meeting; Commissioner Lynch in agreement.

  - Briefing by Rebecca Lee, senior advisor to the Deputy Mayor for Education; focus on Lafayette, Deal, and Jackson-Reed
  - Study process, goals, timeline, Advisory Committee, March deadline (1:45:00)
  - Potential boundary changes (1:50:37)
  - Overcrowding at Lafayette (1:56:35)
  - School capacity, enrollment, lottery preferences for at-risk students (2:03:18)
  - DCPS planning to manage growing enrollments and neighborhood concerns (2:28:05)
  - Commissioner Zeldin expresses interest in coordinating with school parent groups.
  - Resident and Commissioner Lynch question "expanded capacity" and note concern it's more kids in otherwise non-classroom spaces (e.g., basements)
- Project Pipes, Washington Gas \$4 billion initiative to replace old natural gas pipelines in DC (2:341:37)
  - Program likely over budget
  - Washington Gas operates two programs: regular repair and maintenance, and project pipes for pipe replacement, but not all replacements address leaks.

- Concerns about indoor air quality due to natural gas use in homes, particularly in lowerincome areas.
- Environmental coalition campaigns against the project, seeks resolutions from agencies
  (ANCs included) to stop the program
- o Gas leaks and safety concerns of residents in the neighborhood (2:45:55)
- Commissioners discuss how to address gas issues going forward, agree to a further discussion and leading to possible resolution only after all sides are heard, including Washington Gas. (2:50:27)
- DMPED's (DC Deputy Mayor for Panning and Economic Development) RFP (Request for Proposals) for the Chevy Chase Community Center and Library redevelopment. (2:57:33)
  - Commissioner Gosselin expresses disappointment with RFP: lack of public funding and tight deadlines might result in developers prioritizing luxury housing over affordable housing.
  - Former ANC chair Randy Speck on his concerns (3:01:22)
    - RFP not reflective of ANC proposals over the years
    - Insufficient funding and potential compromise on affordable housing
    - Lack of specific requirements for affordable housing and parking in the RFP, which could result in inadequate provisions for the Community Center and Library
    - Requirements and expectations for the developer not fully clear
    - Requirements for public space enhancements could be construed as the District's responsibility, not the developer's
  - Resident concern about coordination and trust with ANC and DMPED, Lynch concurred.
  - Commissioner comments (3:09:20)
    - ANC should propose revisions to the RFP to address concerns.
    - ANC should also seek to extend the filing deadline given issue complexity.
    - Some Commissioners agreed on need for special meeting with Ward Three Councilmember Matt Frumin.
- Annual report, committee updates, and community announcements. (3:15:48)
  - Annual report still in progress
  - ZDD Committee looking to resume with remaining members noting some have apparently dropped off, some might need to be added
  - o Commissioner Lynch voices need to refresh the committee; Chair Gore agrees.
  - Brief discussion of budget and upcoming meeting agenda
- Proposed future special meetings in February on bioretention beds and the DMPED RFP for the Community Center and Library redevelopment, dates TBD (3:20:55)
