ANC 3/4G FIELD TASK FORCE COMMUNITY UPDATE #16

The ANC 3/4G Field Task Force held our sixteenth meeting via Zoom on Wednesday, July 10, 2024. Below is a quick summary of the meeting and the link and passcode to watch the Zoom recording of the full meeting is pasted below. ATTENDEES/INTRODUCTIONS/AGENDA

Task Force co-chair Mike Osborne called the meeting to order at approximately 7:15PM. Four of the six voting Task Force members were in attendance including Co-Chair Mike Osborne, ANC 3/4G Commission Chair Lisa Gore, ANC 3/4G-02 Commissioner Bruce Sherman, and ANC 3/4G-03 Commissioner Jim Nash. Task Force Co-Chair Jenny Backus and community member Marek Gootman could not attend the meeting. Also joining the meeting, non-voting Task Force members Trey Holloway from Maret, Terry Fauntleroy and Jordan Ogbonna from Brailsford & Dunlavey, Maret's Owner's Representative for the field project, attended the meeting as did Maret Principal Dennis Bisgaard. Maret's traffic engineer, Jamie Milanovich, also was present at the meeting.

Close to 30 community members joined the Zoom throughout the meeting.

In addition to the standard Task Force agenda of reviewing questions and concerns regarding the project, the Task Force and Maret announced additional agenda items of discussing vibration monitoring at the Field site and the traffic plan for the site. Co-chair Osborne noted that, since the last Task Force meeting, community members had shared ongoing concerns about vibration monitoring at the site and their views on the landscaping design for the site via emails to the Task Force gmail (ancfieldtf@gmail.com).

UPDATE ON SITE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

- Excavation compacting and grading is occurring on the site. This is expected to continue through the end of September.
- Soil compaction is what causes the vibrations felt by neighbors who live around the site.
- Materials for retaining walls will be delivered in advance of building these walls which will begin after material delivery.
- Work continues on stormwater piping in the southeast corner of the site.
- Vibration monitoring plan developed by ECS and shared with DC's Department of Buildings (DOB) and community members previously.
- Project team notified when certain vibration thresholds are crossed.

There was no sustained exceeding of established vibration thresholds which
would indicate concern as a result of on-site construction activities to date,
although there was isolated exceeding of established vibration thresholds.

Commissioner Sherman asked for an update on Maret's discussions with DOB concerning the vibration monitoring plan. Trey advised that Maret shared this plan with Jeff Reiss at DOB who acknowledged receipt. A DOB inspector visited the site recently but otherwise Maret hasn't heard from DOB about the plan. Trey recognized that homeowners feeling these vibrations is unsettling, but ECS seemed comfortable with the thresholds in the plan. And DOB hasn't expressed any concerns to Maret about the plan.

Two representatives from ECS, Kelly Clawson and Paul Pinkerton, discussed the vibration monitoring plan at length and explained the standards used in the plan. They emphasized that there is no vibration standard in DC code, but ECS used a very conservative industry standard in developing the vibration monitoring plan for the site. Several community members asked questions about the plan and engaged ECS representatives in a discussion. In response to a community member's question, Trey advised that Maret would not be sharing the specific vibration reports generated by the vibration monitors with the community at large because they would not add value to the discussion of this topic. In response to a different community member's question, ECS representatives stated that housing density in the neighborhood had zero impact on vibrations. Commissioner Sherman discussed with the Trey the possibility of sharing specific vibration reports with the homeowners whose vibration monitors send alerts regarding vibrations to the project team. Trey said he would meet with ECS to consider this suggestion.

TRANSPORTATION BRIEFING

Maret's traffic engineer, Jamie Milanovich, then discussed the traffic plan for the site, including issues of pedestrian safety and the possibility of a mid-block crosswalk at or near the entrance to the site off of Nebraska Avenue. She explained in detail why a mid-block crosswalk was not being proposed at the site. She reviewed the multiple enhancements to pedestrian safety to be installed at the intersection of Nebraska and Utah avenues. These are called "bulb-outs" which slow down traffic by extending the curb lines at all four corners of this intersection. These improvements decrease the time it takes for pedestrians to cross the street and reduce the possibility of illegal parking at this intersection. The traffic plan also involves removing conflicting signage and updating the existing signage along Nebraska Avenue by the field site.

Commissioner Nash expressed appreciation for this plan and asked about raised crosswalks or the potential for a HAWK signal in the traffic plan. Ms. Milanovich said that neither was being considered because they didn't meet the relevant criteria for installation at the site. She also explained that there would be no flashing lights on the 15mph school zone signs posted along the site because DDOT advised that the

District was removing these lights from existing 15mph school zone signs and not replacing them throughout the city.

Commissioner Sherman thanked Ms. Milanovich for presenting this plan and asked whether the traffic plan accounted for a separate DDOT plan to install bioretention beds near the intersection of Nebraska and Utah avenues. Ms. Milanovich said that she wasn't aware of the plan for bioretention beds and was surprised that DDOT had approved Maret's traffic plan for the site without making them aware of DDOT's own plan to install bioretention beds at this location. She said that she would follow up with DDOT about this. There also was a discussion of ongoing monitoring of pedestrian and vehicular traffic patterns after the field was in use.

Claudia Russell asked several questions about the intersection of 28th Street and Nebraska Avenue. Ms. Milanovich confirmed that Maret is not proposing to install another crosswalk at this intersection. The traffic plan focuses instead on updating the signage at this location and along the site.

Ann Sutherland raised a concern about jaywalking in the middle of the block where the field sits on Nebraska Avenue and whether a crosswalk could be installed there. Ms. Milanovich explained that DDOT was against this idea because of the poor sight line for drivers cresting the hill on Nebraska Avenue before reaching the field site.

Commissioner Nash raised some additional concerns about pedestrian and cyclist safety once entering the site and inside the site itself. He agreed to submit a list of questions about this matter which Trey said that Maret would try to address.

Co-chair Osborne advised meeting attendees that the next Task Force meeting would be on Wednesday, August 10, 2024, at 7pm on Zoom and any questions for the Task Force could be sent to the Task Force gmail account (ancfieldtf@gmail.com) via email which are auto forwarded to all Task Force members. He thanked everyone for attending this meeting and being patient while he navigated his first Zoom call as a meeting host and ended the meeting at approximately 815pm.

LOOK AHEAD:

- MCN will be re-installing the stone landscaping wall in public space starting on July 9, 2024.
- The utility subcontractor will continue installation of the stormwater management structures and utility lines.
- Saturday work will occur on the site and will continue throughout the Summer per the
 work hours (9AM 5PM) outlined in the MOU. Most of the work performed on
 Saturdays will remain limited to the retaining wall & artificial turf installations. Site
 traffic and noise impacts will remain at a minimum during Saturday work.
- The project team continues to work to keep vibrations to a minimum, but some reworking of soils has been required in recent weeks due to heavy soil moisture content identified during third-party inspections.

- The electrical subcontractor will be on site to begin planning routes for the site's electrical pathways.
- Street signage will continue to be in place along Nebraska Avenue during construction.
- Flaggers will return as necessary during work in public space per the approved DDOT traffic control plan.
- A representative working with DDOT stated that they will be milling and paving tentatively scheduled to start early in the week of July 15, 2024. A notification will be sent again to the neighbors affected by this work.
